

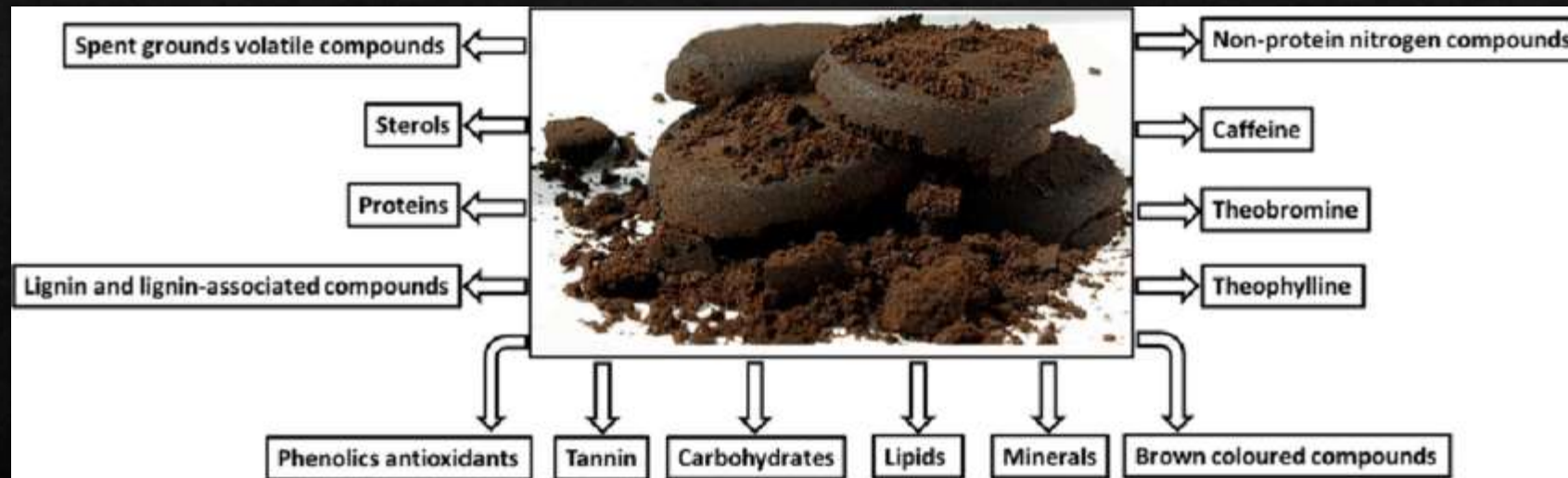
Are you for coffee or

If you told “ yes“ than it mean you are participant in producing of more than 23 million metric tons of coffee waste

Coffee grounds are rich in nitrogen and naturally repel a number of common garden pests. They can even be used to create “barriers” which slugs and snails can’t crawl over. Over time, used grounds can also improve the quality of your garden’s soil, and can be used repeatedly and indefinitely without diminishing returns.



# Solution

Creating network of collecting and composting coffee and citrus waste from Belgrade  
Producing of high reach soil for flowers.  
In Serbia there is around 20 000 restaurans.



- ◆ Network for collecting coffee and citrus waste will be base for getting raw material for compost.
- ◆ Partner shops will get proof that they are eco friendly
- ◆ They will get samples of compost with planted aromatic plants in it.
- ◆ Project can continue funding with selling of compost and planted plants.

To get the full value from used grounds, they should be composted for at least 100 days to reduce their levels of caffeine, chlorogenic acid, and tannins.

Lemon waste is there to enrich compost.



Soil fertilised with composted coffee grounds is most suitable for plants that grow well in slightly acidic soil, such as lilies and blueberries. It should also be kept away from pets, as it can be dangerous if consumed.
